

as of 9/10/19







2019-2020 Capital Revenues






School District of Indian River County 2019-2020 Capital Appropriations

Strong Partnerships with Stakeholders Summer Moonshot Academies

Moonshot Academy provides afterschool literacy instruction and enrichment for students, along with professional development and planning time for teachers. Currently on 7 campuses, the programs take place 3 days a week for 7 weeks and are offered 3 times a year. They provide valuable time on task to help struggling students catch up and give teachers the opportunity to try new strategies which they will then take back to their classrooms. Data shows that the Moonshot Academy program is extremely effective in moving struggling and at risk readers to proficiency.

STEP into Kindergarten program, which takes place at Osceola and Liberty Magnet schools. STEP into Kindergarten promotes readiness for school success and a positive transition into Kindergarten. 


"Code Skools"

The School District of Indian River County has partnered with The South Florida Accelerator for the second year in a row to host a summer coding camp through Code Skools. This \$15,000 per person program is a FREE opportunity for upcoming 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students who attend Vero Beach and Sebastian River High Schools. The class is held at Indian River State College Mueller Campus. In this camp, students learn JavaScript, HTML, CSS, Ruby, & Ruby on Rails, and graduate at the end of the summer with industry certifications and apprenticeship opportunities.
