

READING AT HOME: USING I-READY RESULTS TO FIND BOOKS!







How do I help my child choose books that are appropriate?



When looking for books to read at home, remember the following tips!

- ➤ Your child should be interested in the topic. Allow him/her to help choose the books.
- Encourage your child to read a variety of genres, or different kinds, of books.
- Reading together is always fun!
- Choose a book that is at the "just right" level for your child. They should be able to read MOST of the text on their own. One way to do this is to know your child's LEXILE LEVEL.




What is a Lexile Level?

- A Lexile Level measures the reading level of a book. It indicates how easy or difficult the text is to read.
- After a student takes the i-Ready Diagnostic Assessment, they are given a Lexile Level. If they choose books using their personal level, they should be able to read and comprehend the majority of the book, with maybe just a little help.

Make sure to click **SUBMIT!**








